

For 12 of the first half of their 55-year marriage, the Dyers had the privilege of serving on the staff of World Vision International, a Christian service organization. The mission of World Vision International is to follow the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in working with poor and oppressed people in over 100 countries throughout the world. Their work provided them ministry opportunities in six third-world nations, the first of which was Vietnam, near the end of the Vietnam War.
